Why I Serve at the Bridge Academy

Although beginning with the first and second graders about eight years ago, I quickly realized that the middle school age group was the best fit for me. Yet, many nights I find myself asking the question "Why serve at BACC?" After a few hours of dealing with a loud, rambunctious and sometimes disrespectful group of 12 to 15-year-olds, I cannot help but wonder "What difference are we making?"

But we are. One of the most satisfying outcomes for me is watching the maturation process as these children evolve into teens over their three years at Middle School Night. Packing 40 6th-8th graders in one room is a challenge for anyone! But over the years you can see a transformation (especially in lesson time) from giddy kids to attentive young adults. Through it all I know we are having a positive impact. By showing up week after week, year after year, we are demonstrating the love of Christ to young folks who may never have seen Jesus' second greatest commandment in action - to 'Love your neighbor as yourself' (Matthew 22:39).

To effectively share the gospel with someone you first need to build a relationship. The staff and volunteers do that daily, and that is why the BACC works. We know the kids and moms are going back into an environment where cultural pressures pull them away from a relationship with Christ. But the BACC represents a safe, nurturing haven where they return to hear the gospel message over and over again. Just as importantly, they witness people living out their faith. Won't you join us?

The Lord has blessed the Bridge Academy and Community Center greatly in 2017. This year the Bridge Academy celebrates fifteen years of ministry in Coatesville! What an honor it is to serve as a part of the team of seventy five regular volunteers, two part time and two full time staff, eight faithful board members and countless prayer warriors, in-kind and financial donors.

- Over 500 people have participated in programming this year, with 65 women and 435 students.
